



WHY DIABLOS ROJOS?

There are different versions of the name of the team that was founded in 1941 as Club México. The first person to refer to the team as the “Red Devils” was the brilliant journalist Alejandro Aguilar Reyes, known as “Fray Nano,” who, in one of his columns, highlighted the team’s fierce play and immense desire to win. This note was written a year after the team’s debut.

The other version, which many fans may have read or heard, attributes the creation of the name to Basilio “el Brujo” Rosell, who was one of the team's coaches in 1942. It is said that at the end of a thrilling game against Monterrey, in which Mexico secured a 14-13 victory despite being down by seven runs in the ninth inning, the great former pitcher—who served as an umpire during the game—exclaimed with great emotion, "These Reds play like Devils."

In both cases, it is important to note that these versions highlight the winning legacy and hallmark of the Diablos Rojos del México.
